For a number of years the Springfield Police Department has published an Annual Report covering crime data for the City of Springfield and information about the Police Department. With this knowledge, the Community and the Police Department can work together to develop effective crime abatement strategies and ensure the quality of life in the City of Springfield.

2011 was the first full calendar year of operations for the Municipal jail. Since it's opening, over 3,600 misdemeanor offenders have been booked into the jail, where they are held until they either post bail or appear before a judge. I believe that the certainty of punishment has had a significant and positive effect on property crimes in Springfield. The jail will continue to be an important resource in our community for many years to come. We are grateful for the support of our dedicated elected officials, and of our citizens.




