

HISTORY MAKER AWARD NOMINATION FORM 2024 SPRINGFIELD HERITAGE AWARDS

The Springfield Heritage Awards are presented annually to recognize significant achievements in stewardship of the physical and cultural heritage of the geographic area we now call Springfield, Oregon.

Presented by the Springfield Historic Commission and the Springfield History Museum, these awards recognize a broad array of stewardship activities that increase awareness, appreciation, and support an inclusive perspective of local heritage.

Award recipients are selected by the Mayor. The Mayor's award will be informed by input from a jury that includes representatives of the Historic Commission and the History Museum Committee and members of the community selected by the Mayor. This is a recognition award promoting exceptional commitment and achievement; no monetary awards are associated with this program. Up to 3 awards per category may be presented each year, at the discretion of the Mayor with input from the jury.

The History Maker Award honors an individual/organization/company/public agency who has made significant contributions to the enrichment, conservation, knowledge and dissemination of local heritage. Reasons to nominate include:

- Demonstrated leadership in preserving and fostering appreciation of local heritage.
- Revitalization of a history-related organization.
- Efforts to engage underrepresented communities in history-related activities.
- For scholarship, public service, conservation and preservation efforts, special events, and teaching.
- For those who have had a positive impact on the ways in which audiences and/or communities are engaged in history.

Eligibility Criteria:

Nominee is not required to be located in Springfield, but their body of work must demonstrate a strong focus and/or impact within the Urban Growth Boundary (UGB) of Springfield. Any individual, organization, company, or local, state or federal agency involved in historic preservation is eligible for nomination.
