### **SUMMARY**

Establishes a procedure to provide fundamental tools and supplies necessary to carry out crime scene processing responsibilities effectively.

# **DISCUSSION**

## **POLICY**

I

Specialty crime scene equipment is available to crime scene personnel. Additional equipment is available through mutual aid from other departments.; for example, Fire and Life Safety units are equipped with special lighting equipment, generators, ladders, power tools and other specialty items. An overhead view of a crime scene may be made from the Fire Department's snorkel truck. Helicopters are available from the Lane County Sheriff's Department and other sources. Oregon State Police laboratory personnel are available should plaster or silicone impressions be needed at a scene. Eugene Police Department's bomb squad is available should the scene dictate explosive expertise. The Department of Environmental Quality and Drug Enforcement Agency can assist in the handling of toxic/hazardous materials.

Safety devices such as goggles, safety glasses, paper clothing and shoe covers, face protectors, ear protectors, gloves, etc. are provided to carry out assigned duties in a safe manner.

Officers have access to still and video cameras, latent print kits, lighting equipment, blood test kits and portable scene processing kits

Packaging materials are available in the property booking room and may be transported to the field if necessary.

Property personnel have access to the property van which is furnished with the following:

40 lb. bag absorbent

Electric extension cords,

Rope

**Bolt cutters** 

Asst. sockets, ratchets, hacksaws, hammers

Rubber boots

Cardboard boxes, wraps for breakables

Paper and plastic bags

Eye wash

Additional protective clothing

First aid kit.
