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### FY23 Initiatives

- Police & Jail Local Option Levy Renewal Process
  - Fully funds the Springfield Municipal Jail
  - Funds approximately 41 jail, police and court positions
  - Funding supports efficient response times, increased # of patrol/ community service officers, and reduction in crime.
  - Levy funds 28.6% of the PD FY2023 proposed budget
  - Current levy provides funding through June 2023 at a rate of \$1.40
    per \$1,000 assessed value

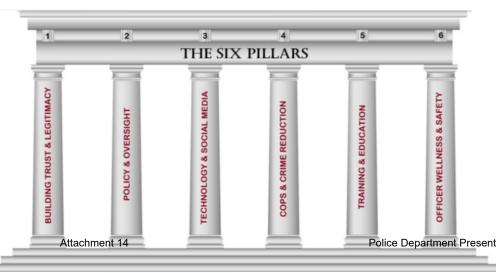
