What does the project include?

A paving overlay will be applied to Centennial Boulevard from Aspen Street to Prescott Street. Sidewalk ramps have been updated to meet current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

Will there be a street closure on Centennial Blvd?

For this phase of work which begins Wednesday, August 10, one lane will be closed each night with flaggers directing traffic.

How will this affect me?

You may experience minor travel delays during construction. You also may hear and see signs of construction. Access for pedestrians, including those using a wheelchair, will be available through or around the work zone.

Why do the project?

Springfield voters approved a five-year, \$10 million general obligation bond to fund street repairs on a list of priority commercial streets in need of repair, including a 2,600 foot section of Centennial Boulevard. These repairs will extend the useful life of the street.
