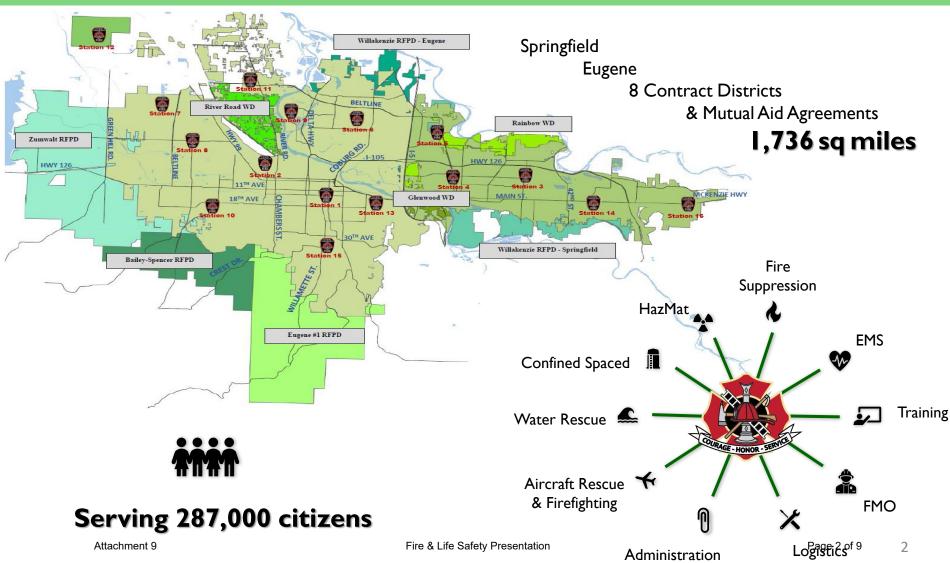

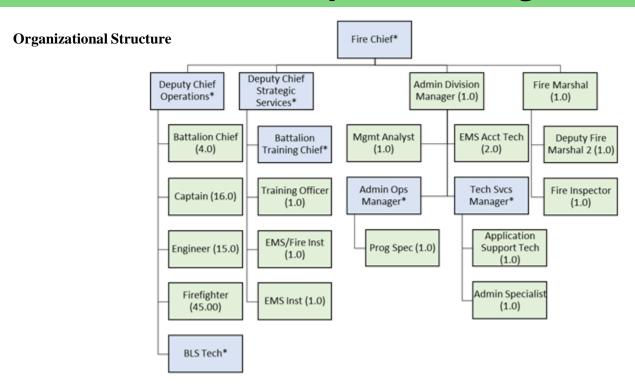

- Public assistance, traffic accidents, false alarms, and other nonmedical/non-fire calls.

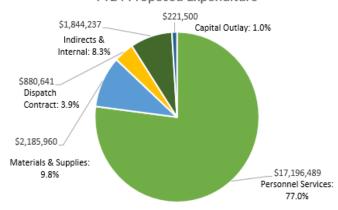

### FY23 Accomplishments

#### **Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG)**

- COS portion \$100,000
- Provides for state of the art <u>mechanical CPR devices</u> for 6 apparatus.
- Supports ESF's HEARTSafe Community initiative

#### Conflagration

- Deployed to 6 separate wildfires
- Invoiced OSFM over \$45k for Springfield's portion
- Largest response was Elbow Creek
- Springfield's Portion = \$24k





#### **Fuels Reduction**

- North West Youth Corps collaboration on various fuels mitigation and defensible space projects around Eugene and Springfield.
- Provided an opportunity for NWYC to visit a <u>large scale wildfire</u> <u>exercise</u> in the Thurston Hills Natural Area

#### **2022 Special Events**
