Staffing update:

- On-call staff are working solo shifts and we are grateful to have them.
- Youth Services Librarian:
 - o Seven people were interviewed via Zoom.
 - o Three will be invited back for in-person interviews in mid-September.

Remodel:

- The bid process should open again in September
- We have been working with IT make plans for turning the Library Meeting Room into a workspace for part of the staff during the remodel
- I have been in touch with a company about covering some of the columns in the library to turn them into wayfinding posts.
 - o 5 will be covered,
 - a welcome post in different languages near the new front desk
 - Kids & Tweens
 - Teen Area
 - Friends of the Library and History Museum Books Store
 - One in the adult area
 - We have not settled on any graphics or design yet

<u>Passport Program –</u> I am providing this information share here and will leave this on the agenda for further discussion if needed

- Suggestions from other libraries in LCOL that use the Passport program:
 - There are three other libraries in LCOL that use the program: Siuslaw, Cottage Grow and
 Creswell with 27, 19 and 1 active card respectively
 - To set up an account the person needs ID and home library card. Call home library to verify a patron in good standing
 - Type of card they use, and access varies by library
- Thoughts on how we will set up for SPL:
 - o 3-month renewal period
 - o 10 items at a time
 - No access to electronic resources
 - o Can we use their home library card #? And we put an SPL sticker on their card?
 - Do we need to set up a distinctive card profile type (Cottage Grove uses TOUR)
 - We need to work with our technology specialist to see the best way to set up the accounts in our system
- Who are we helping with this?
 - SPL patrons traveling elsewhere in Oregon who would like a card at a Passport library
 - o People visiting here from other Passport libraries in Oregon

Fine Free stats

- 11,739 accounts had fines forgiven
- Of these, 3284 were blocked
- 2834 are cards that expired within the last two years. These patrons are being emailed and invited to renew their cards.
