Grants

- Oregon Community Foundation grant submitted for support of pop-up library events in 2024
 - Working with five community organizations to co-locate events
 - Grant would provide additional funding for SR support person to extend time from Feb –
 Aug.
- LSTA:
 - The final report for the first year of the LCOL User Strategies grant + 2 month extension was submitted. We are officially into year two of this grant
 - The LCOL libraries will have a cataloging summit on Oct 5 to ensure that the same practices are being followed in the different libraries. These efforts will help clean up our catalog and make it easier to search.

<u>Outreach to the Spanish- speaking community</u>: Since July, SPL and SHM had a presence at the Migrant Education Summer School program, the Migrant Education Community Mercado event, Noche Cultural (in Island Park) and the Hispanic Heritage Month Celebration (at the Fountain Plaza).

Plaza Programs final numbers:

- This summer we hosted 9 artist groups for 12 events, presented to over 4,000 people and gave away 500 program-themed literacy/activity kits from Springfield Public Library and Springfield History Museum to children and families.
- We featured a diverse array of at least 7 languages (English, Spanish, Zulu, Arabic,
 Portuguese, Chinese, Hindi, Gadangme), cultures from around the world, and artistic
 expressions including circus arts; ballet folklorico; Zimbabwean and South African music and
 dance; East African music and dance; North African/Middle Eastern and Spanish music,
 instruments and poetry; Bollywood Bhangra music and dance; hip-hop music, lyric and
 dance; traditional and contour inter-tribal Native American music, instruments, dance and
